The Health Information Systems (HIS) Recap

At the end of November NSH announced it was contracting out scanning and indexing to Iron Mountain, a multinational firm, thus eliminating 91 Health Information System jobs across the Province. For the next week NSH met with these members via telephone to deliver the news with no answers to their many questions. CUPE and NSGEU immediately began gathering information and lobbying government to try and stop the contacting out of good, public sector jobs. It was a long road with many twists and turns, but on January 22, 2021, President Bev Strachan delivered this message to our members, "NSH has announced today that they will not be contracting out your scanning and indexing work to Iron Mountain". "Today we stand in the positive news that contracting out of public work to a private company will not occur."
